


### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE:





## 'The Sentimental Bloke' turned 100 in 2019!

One of Australia's greatest silent films now celebrates its centenary with a new digital restoration by the NFSA, and an extraordinary musical score composed and performed live by ARIA award-winner Paul Mac.

Based on the verse novel *The Songs of a Sentimental Bloke* by CJ Dennis, this is a tale of romance, jealousy, temptation and redemption. It tells the story of Bill 'The Kid' (Arthur Tauchert), a larrikin who cleans up his act when the beautiful Doreen (Lottie Lyell) enters his life.

Directed by legendary filmmaker Raymond Longford, *The Sentimental Bloke* is set in the then-rough streets of Woolloomooloo and the beaches of Manly, offering contemporary audiences a rare glimpse of Sydney 100 years ago. A huge box-office hit at the time, *The Sentimental Bloke* is one of the few silent-era Australian films to have survived in its entirety.

Presented by NFSA Restores, an exciting program to digitise, restore and preserve, at the highest archival standards, classic and cult Australian films so they can be seen on the big screen in today's digital cinemas.

Dear Friends.

I am writing on behalf of the CIFF Committee.

This year's short CIFF event took place last weekend with full houses for each of the 3 sessions, and very positive feedback. Audience range was from young to elderly, and we were very pleased that quite a number of local filmmakers were present for all three films: we seem to be getting some traction with the right people.

As you know, with the re-direction of local government grants for the arts, we are fighting hard to re-build our financial base, and the Friends' very kind grant of \$500 was of critical importance in allowing us to keep going with our event. We are hoping that the response last weekend will bring some strong interest from philanthropists, and we are hopeful of returning to a larger event in 12 months' time. My hope is that we can grow from three screenings this year to 18 films next year over 6 days.

The Friends' support was acknowledged at each session on the screen and in our program brochure. We couldn't have done it with this support!

If the Friends group is willing and able to contribute again for 2020, we will be immensely grateful. ## PRESIDENT'S REPORT TO AGM 2019 - Ray Edmondson, 29.11.19

The role of the Friends, as a visible part of the NFSA's constituency, is to act as a public advocate and support the NFSA in fulfilling its mandate, to increase public awareness and to offer a membership program. This financial year (2018-19) the Friends has maintained its ongoing program of events and member benefits and been an active advocate for the NFSA.

**Advocacy** The Friends are concerned about the cumulative effects of the Government's continuing, so-called "efficiency dividend" budget cuts on the NFSA. As an independent body the Friends can advocate for the NFSA's needs as it sees them, and its Advocacy Subcommittee arranged several in-person visits to relevant politicians. We have supported the call for increased funds to digitise the NFSA collection.

In May 2018 the Friends had made a lengthy submission to the Parliamentary Inquiry on Canberra's National Institutions (for the text, visit the Friends website). In its final report in April 2019 the Committee recommended greater cooperation between institutions, and certain relief from swingeing "efficiency dividend" cuts. It also recommended that the Government acknowledge the need for the digitisation of analogue audio-visual items in the collections of the institutions, to ensure that all such material is digitally preserved by 2025, and develop a clear and coherent whole of government strategy across institutions to get this done. https://www.aph.gov.au/Parliamentary\_Business/Committees/Joint/National\_Capital\_and\_External\_Territories/NationalInstitutions/Report

**Volunteer activities** have continued, with the staffing of the NFSA Library on Wednesday afternoons. Volunteers have taken over the task of preparing the NFSA's ongoing contribution to FIAF's *International Index for Film Periodicals*.

Regular **film screenings and other events** by NFSA are promoted by the Friends, which whenever possible operates a greeting table in the lobby in advance of screenings. Friends members gain discounted entry to screenings and to other events. We were delighted to see the NFSA's public gallery reopened in August 2018 with the Heath Ledger exhibition.

The **Argonauts page** on the Friends website has continued to quietly gather reminiscences from former members of this highly influential children's club on ABC radio, which makes a distinctive addition to the NFSA's collection, since so little remains of the original radio broadcasts. The Argonauts signature song (which can be heard on the website) features on the NFSA *Sounds of Australia* register.

**Profile** The Friends *Newsletter* was published in August 2018 and February 2019 and distributed to members. The Friends' Facebook page (<a href="www.facebook.com/NFSAFriends">www.facebook.com/NFSAFriends</a>) and website (<a href="www.archivefriends.org.au">www.archivefriends.org.au</a>) publicise both Friends and NFSA activities. A hotlink on the NFSA website also points to the Friends' website. The website was extensively revamped during the year.

**Events** The Friends' partnership with CMAG (Canberra Museum and Gallery) continued and offered a monthly "Friday with Friends" afternoon presentation in the CMAG theatrette. CMAG is in the heart of Civic with convenient parking, good public transport and a friendly café. It allows the possibility of projecting 16mm film, now a disappearing experience. This series complemented presentations in the NFSA theatrette with its full range of facilities for digital presentation. The list of events:

**Melbourne Chapter** Discussions were commenced with a group of Melbourne members towards the possibility of establishing a Melbourne chapter of the Friends, able to mount its own public events.

**Canberra International Film Festival 26 to 28 October 2018:** The Friends was a sponsor of the festival and a collaborator in its organisation. Screenings were in the Arc cinema and Friends' members were given discounted entry to all sessions.

**Relations with NFSA** The Friends Committee worked closely with CEO Jan Müller, Karina Libbey and other staff and appreciated their support and cooperation.

**Membership** remains small compared with Friends organisations of other national memory institutions.

I would like to thank the members of our very hard working voluntary committee, which has met approximately monthly over the year. I want to especially acknowledge the huge contribution of Vice President Chris Harrison over many years as he retires from the Committee at this meeting. Finally, I thank the staff of CMAG for their support of our afternoon presentations.

## Tap and Donate at the NFSA!
